Kristy and I wanted to send you an invitation for us all to come together as a neighborhood and send an important message about inclusion, love and support during the upcoming Pride Week which is May 26 – June 2, 2019.

The Utah Pride Center has an initiative for pride week - they will provide a 3x5 rainbow flag in front of a home or business for the duration of Pride Week (projectrainbowutah.org) to send a message of acceptance, love, peace, harmony and safety to the LGBTQ+ community for a \$10 donation.

We thought it would be just amazing if our Neighborhood would send the message loud and clear to our LGBTQ+ family members, neighbors and friends that this neighborhood is safe and that love, peace and hope is here for everyone and that each and every person is accepted unconditionally.

This is an important message for us to send to the LGBTQ+ community in Utah as many LGBTQ+ youth in Utah are unsure of where and how they fit in to our community and often struggle with depression and even suicide.

The message that we are sending is that our neighborhood is safe - that all people, regardless of race, color, gender, religion or sexual identity are welcome and treated equally with love, compassion and respect.

If we, as a collective neighborhood, send this message with rainbow flags in front of each home and only one person sees it as a beacon of love, acceptance and a message of hope, it is worth it. If other neighborhoods see it as an example and choose to send similar messages of love and inclusion to their family, friends and neighbors, then even better.

To make this happen, Kristy and I and other members of the neighborhood will cover the cost of a flag for your yard during Pride Week if you would like or you can contribute \$10.
